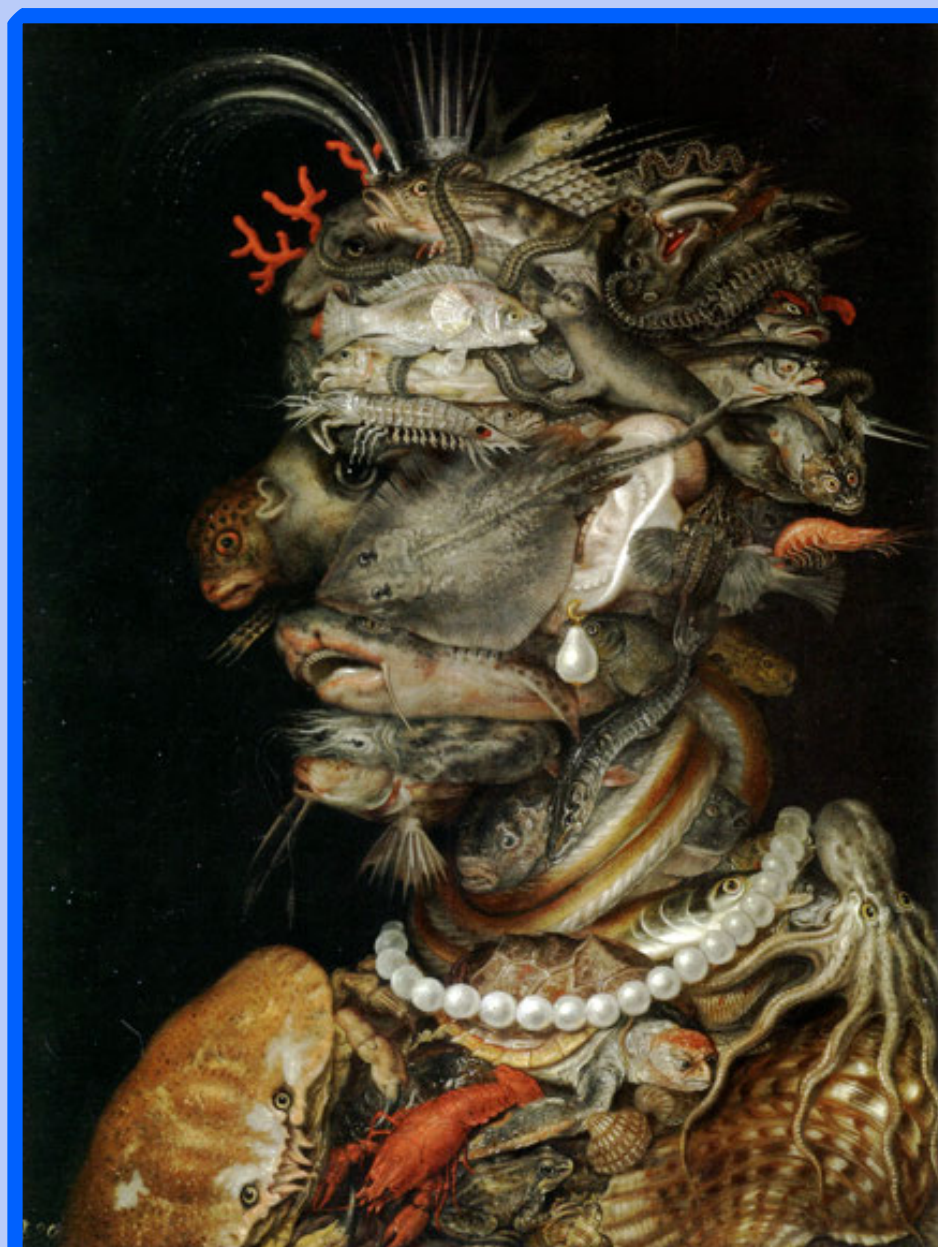

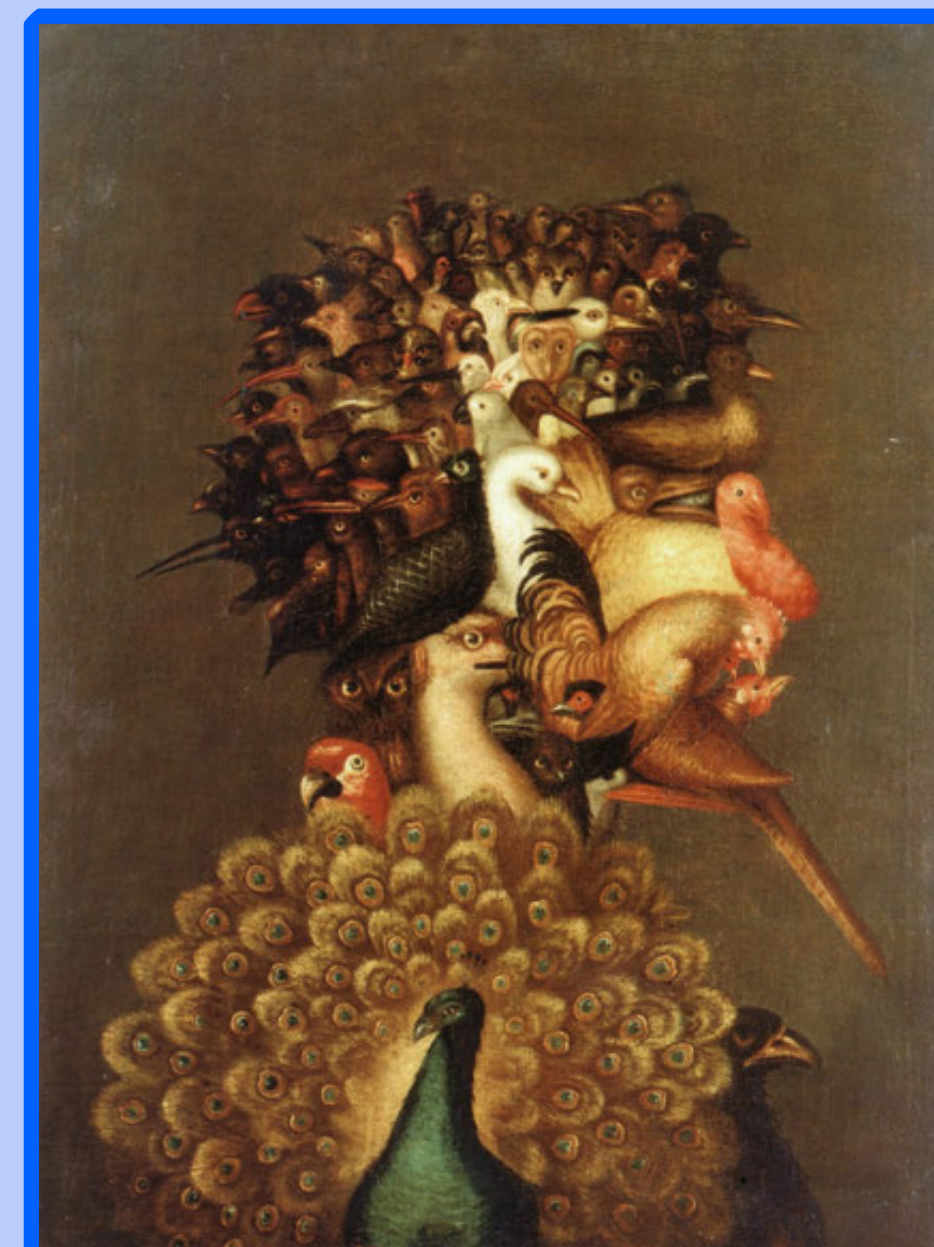




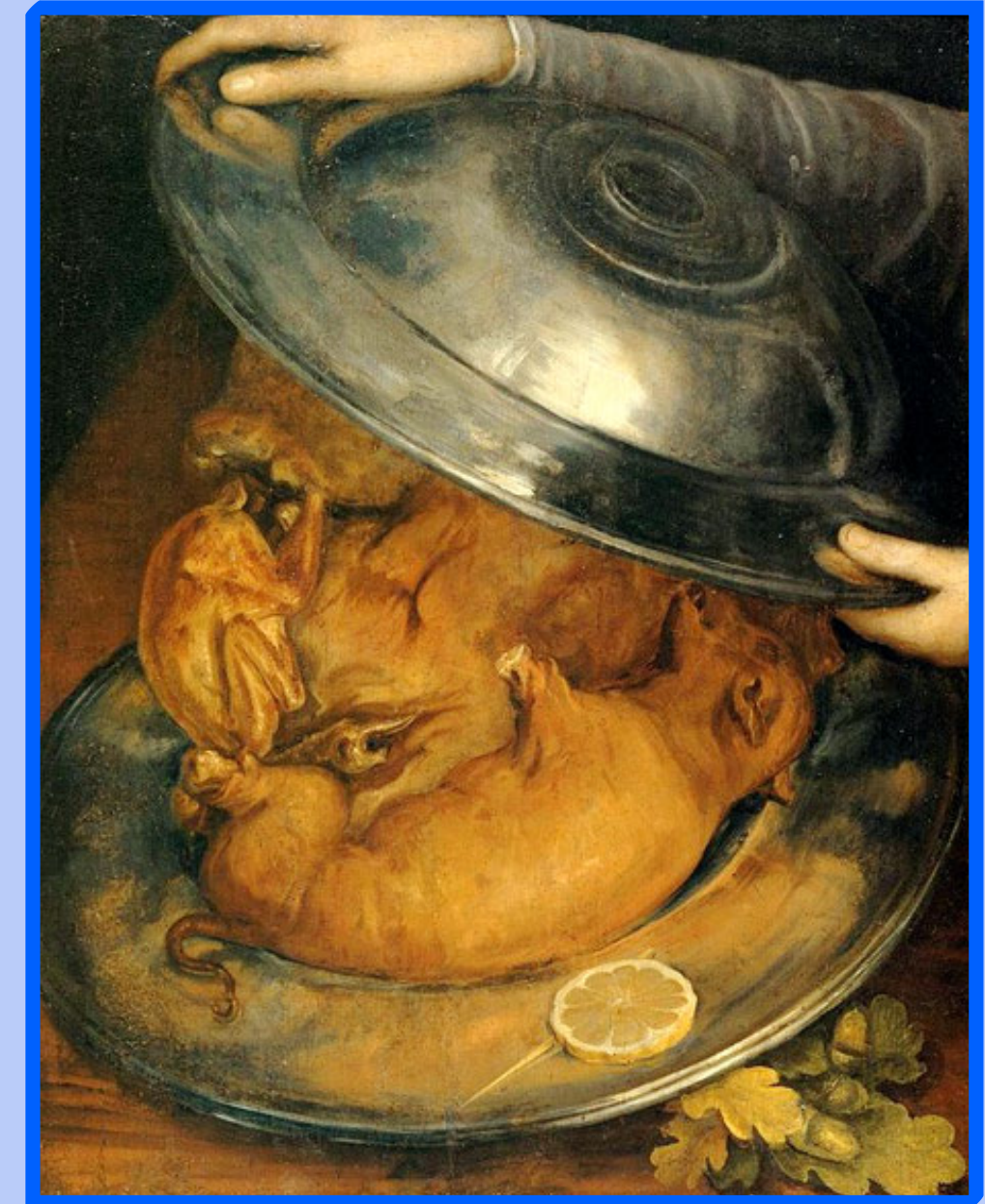

What do all these paintings have in common?

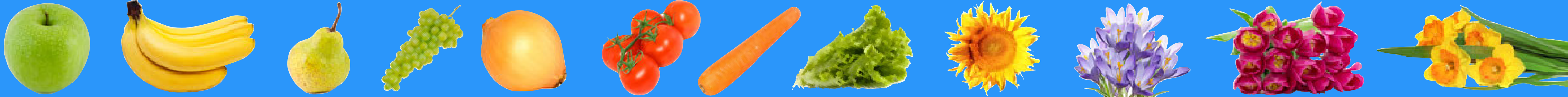

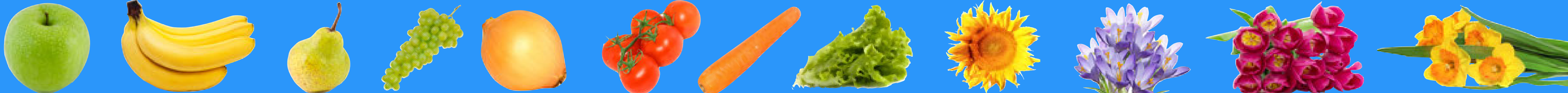




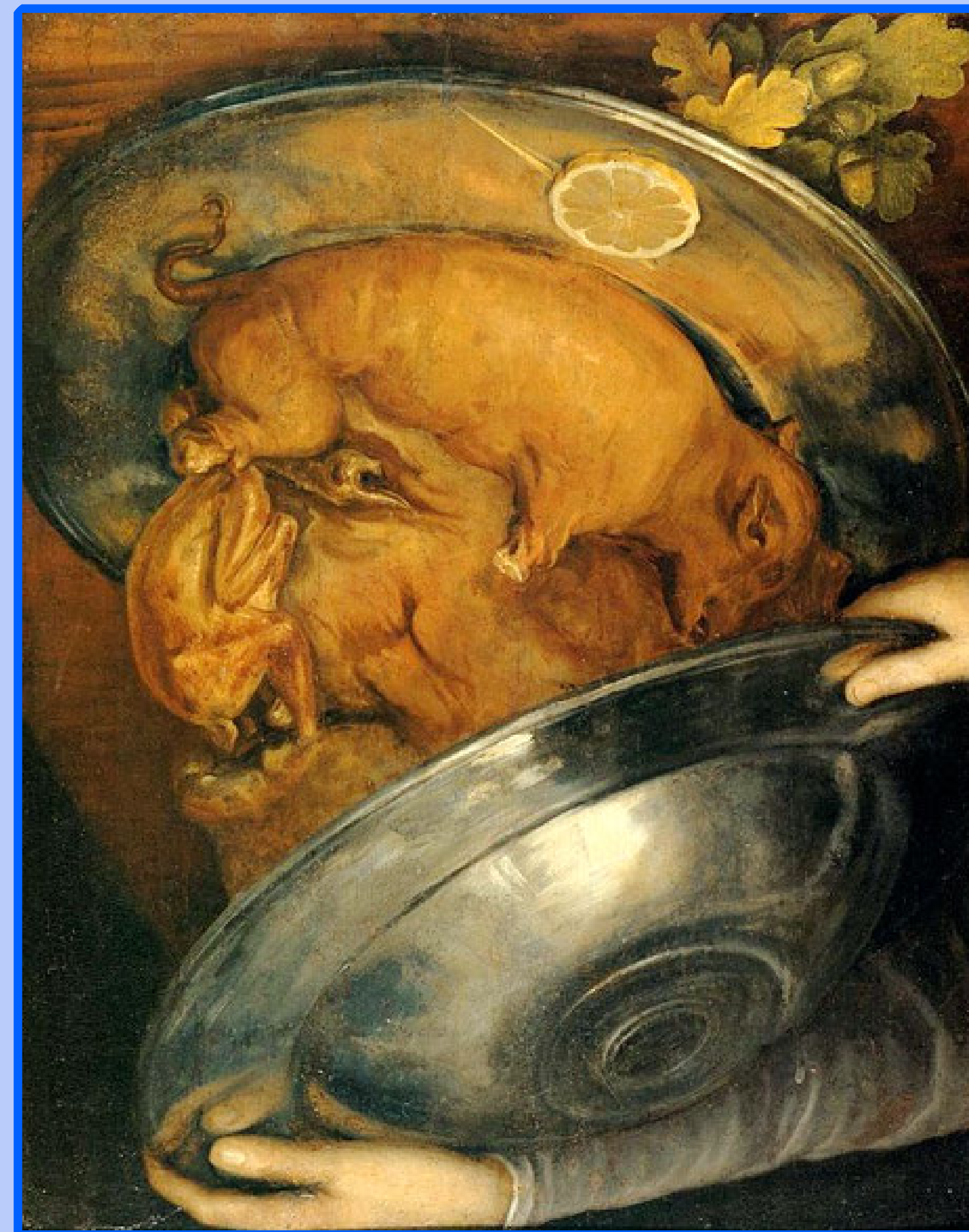
The Cook

This painting is called The Cook. Can you spot the cook's face in this plate of roasted meats?



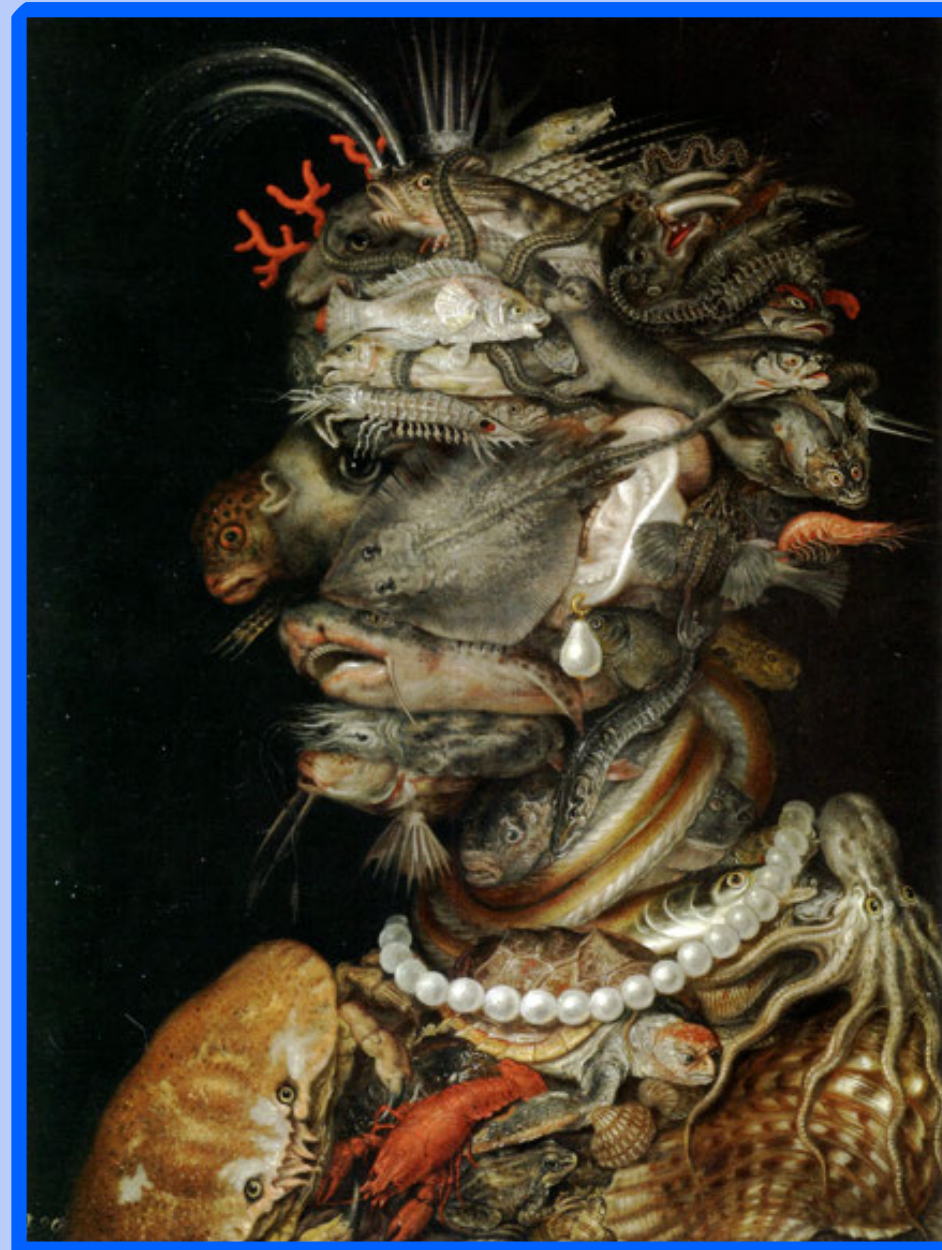


Arcimboldo hid the face in this portrait. To spot the cook you need to turn the picture upside down!





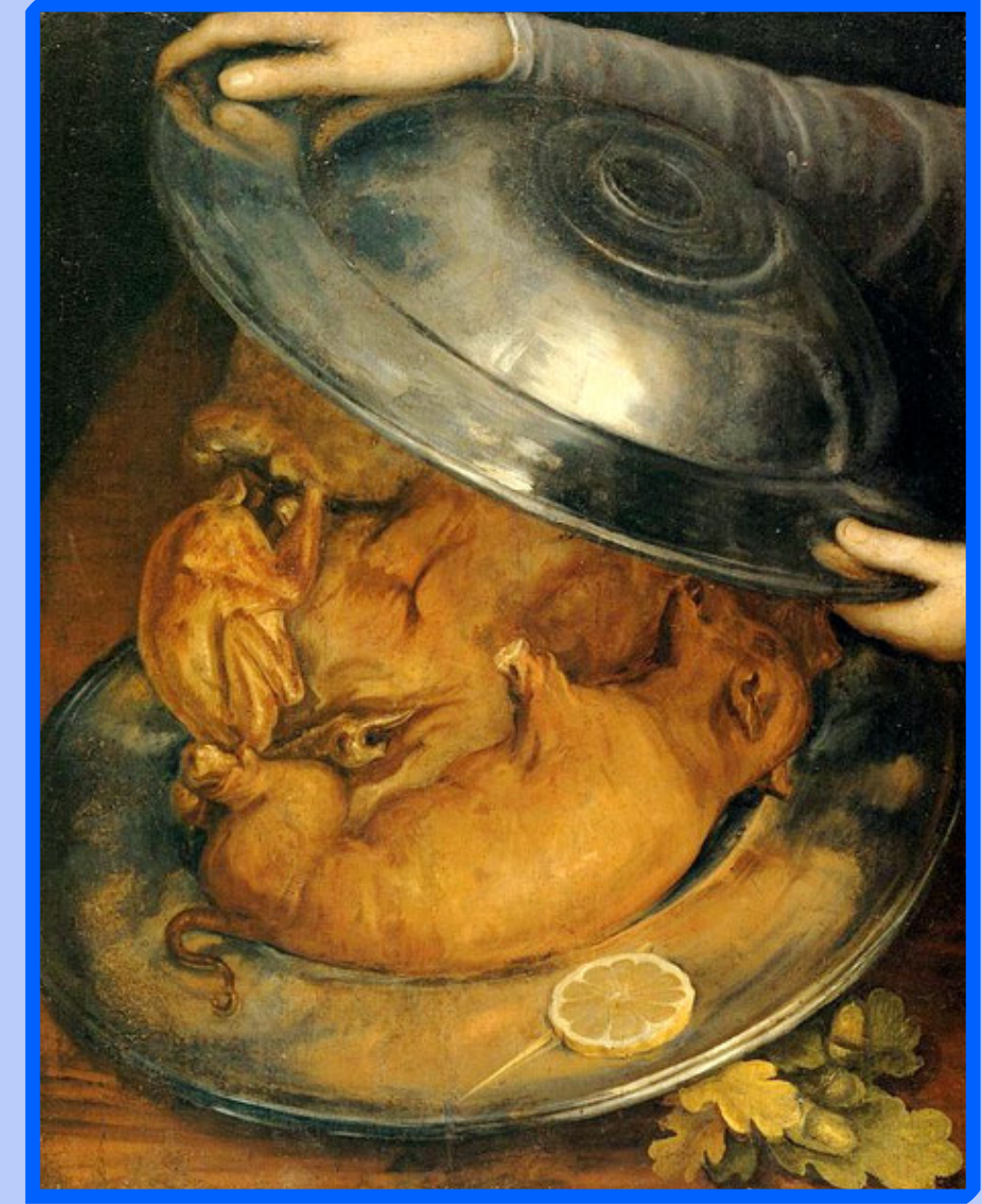
