

















This is Giuseppe Arcimboldo. He painted portraits that are made up of natural materials like fruits, vegetables, plants and animals. He painted using oil paints.



This is a portrait Arcimboldo painted of the four seasons.






























Do you think many people liked the vicechancellor?





























The Jurist

If you were painting a librarian what items would you include in the portrait?





























The Librarian


Rooms in libraries were divided by curtains like the one Arcimboldo painted in this picture.







